### Footnotes:

(1) The Hellenic Community of Montreal (HCM) is a registered charitable, non-profit organisation. It is the largest Greek community organisation outside of Greece, in existence since 1906, offering educational, religious, social, athletic and cultural services to the Greek population of the greater Montreal region. In 2010, the HCM amalgamated with the Greek Orthodox Community of Laval (GOCL), and became the Hellenic Community of Greater Montreal (HCGM). The HCGM has an annual budget exceeding \$ 18M, real estate valued at approximately \$ 50M and staff of over 400 employees.

<sup>(2)</sup> The Socrates Elementary School of the HCGM is a private educational institution recognised by the Ministry of Education, Recreation and Sports in Quebec and the Ministry of Education of Greece. In existence for over 100 years, it offers a trilingual, daily academic program from pre-kindergarten to grade six. With the 2010 amalgamation of the HCM with the GOCL, the Socrates and Demosthenes elementary schools joined forces and currently cater to approximately 1400 students in 5 campuses across the greater Montreal region.

<sup>(3)</sup> The Supplementary Education programme of the HCGM offers Greek language instruction on Saturdays, from pre-kindergarten to Secondary/Lyceum to approximately 850 students across the greater Montreal region.

<sup>(4)</sup> Secretary of Education, member of the Board of Directors responsible for the Socrates Elementary School system.

(5) The Quebec Hellenic Congress (QHC) is an umbrella lobby organisation that is a member of the Canadian Hellenic Congress (CHC). The QHC's mandate is to represent the socio-political concerns of Quebecers of Greek descent to different governmental jurisdictions in Quebec and to Quebec society. The CHC is the national democratic communal institution that represents, advances, advocates and promotes the interests and concerns of Canadians of Hellenic descent and Hellenism in general. The CHC is the national voice of Hellenes and their communities and/or organisations across Canada.

<sup>(6)</sup> The Kastorian Society of Montreal "Omonia" is a socio-cultural association founded in 1955. It represents Montrealers of Hellenic descent from the region of Kastoria in Macedonia, Greece.

<sup>(7)</sup> The Hellenic Ladies Benevolent Society (HLBS) is an autonomous, chartered, non-profit organisation that came into existence in Montreal in 1922. The first of its kind in North America, its mandate is to help the disadvantaged within greater Montreal region, by providing emergency relief, such as food, rent, clothing, utilities, medical expenses, and establishing community projects, including summer camps for children, the elderly and the handicapped.

(8) The American College of Dentists (ACD) is the oldest major honorary organisation for dentists. Its members have exemplified excellence through outstanding leadership and exceptional contributions to dentistry and society. Its mission is to advance **excellence**, **ethics**, **professionalism** and **leadership** in dentistry. Fellowship in the ACD is by invitation and it is based on a proven, confidential, peer- review system that has remained intact since the inception of the College in 1920. Fellows of the College have records of leadership, excellence, and meritorious achievement in dentistry or public service. There is also an ethical component to Fellowship as specified in early College records, "The candidate... must be of good moral character, and have a reputation for ethical conduct and professional standing that is unquestioned.
